

Bobcats Get League Win!

The CCHS football opened Southern League play with a victory over the Swink Lions on Saturday at Henrich Field. The Bobcats pinned the Lions deep in their own territory on the opening kick-off which set up good field position for most of the first quarter. The Custer County defense got stingy as they did not allow a 1st down in the entire first half. “Our defense played very well in the 1st half,” stated Coach Bomgardner. “Not allowing a first down was a big step for our defense gaining some confidence.”

Offensively, the Bobcats struggled in putting points on the board with turnovers ending promising drives.

The lone score in the first half came on a busted play that Jordan Rhodes salvaged by spotting Conner Rowley downfield with Rowley taking the reception in for a score. Rhodes added the extra point and the Bobcats would keep the lead going into the half.

“It was frustrating seeing us drive the ball up and down the field only to lose it in a turnover,” said Bomgardner.

Coming out the second half saw the Bobcats quickly drive down again the Lions 15-yd line, only to see the ball coughed up again. This time, the Lions took advantage and reeled off a long touchdown run. A failed conversion kept the score 8-6. The next 2 drives saw the Bobcats again turn the ball back to the Lions. Giving the ball away in their own territory forced the Bobcats to rise to the occasion to stop the Lions. “I was very proud of the way we stopped them in the third quarter,” Bomgardner noted. “It was tough to keep our heads up when we kept turning the ball over, but our defense found a way to stop

them and keep the lead. To me, this won the game for us.”

After the second stop on their own 25, the Bobcats answered quickly with a 75-yard touchdown run by Connor Rowley. The play was run near perfection by the Bobcats with a great kickout block by Bryce Roscoe and down block by Casey Brandon. “It was just a good football play,” exclaimed Bomgardner. “It was well-executed by all, and if you give Connor an inch, he is going to take a mile.” Andy Feldmann added the 2-point conversion to make it 16-6.

The defense stopped them again,

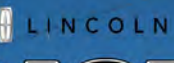

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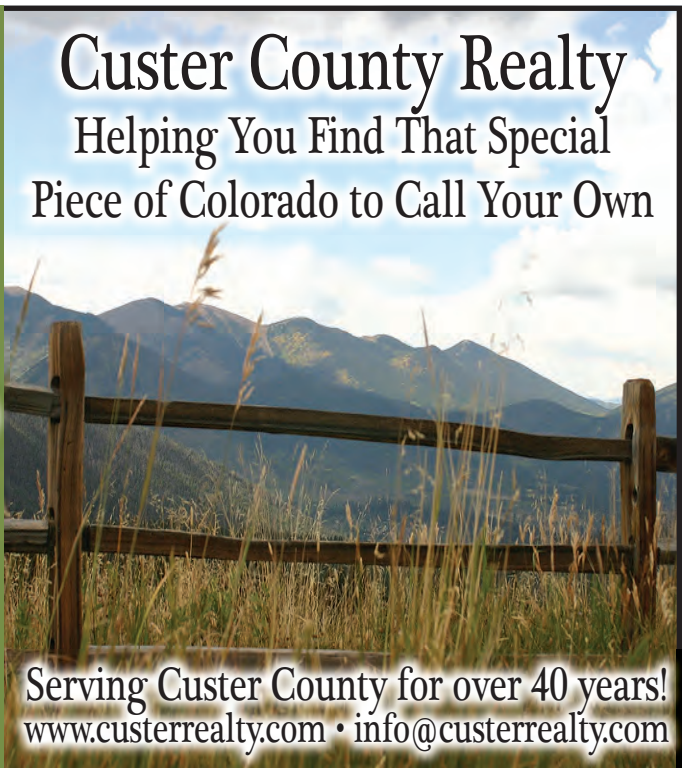

Ask a Pro: Dilemma- Steel Casing or Plastic

State Regulation requires steel surface casing for the first 20 or 40 ft. pending type of construction and formation. After that it is at the drillers discretion whether to use steel, plastic or nothing at all.

Steel casing has a limited lifespan. Steel corrodes in water, concrete and in most formations. The life span of plastic in a well out of the sun is so long that it has yet to be determined. I prefer to use plastic when possible as it has proven to be far superior to steel and does not corrode. Steel casing is used in formations that cave or collapse. Steel casing is driven or drilled into the ground and is a safe haven for a drillers

bit and tools. Many drillers do not want to extend their bit very far beyond this safe haven. Different drilling techniques and the willingness to take risks allow us to use much less steel. This saves thousands of dollars not only in the cost of drilling but in the cost of dealing with: rusty water, rusty toilets, sinks, showers, pressure tanks, pipes, water heaters, dish & clothes washers, discolored clothes, corroded casing ect....David J. Custer County School Board Update

The Custer County School Board meeting began at 5:30 p.m. with the Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance. The only Trustee not present was Robert Jolley. Guests were recognized and Chairman Gaide requested two modifications to the agenda. They were approved and the Board moved directly to public comments.

Superintendent Chris Selle reported the student enrollment for the year stands at 395 plus one half counted student. The budget was built on a student count of 385. The negative factor from the state is still around \$495,000. The revenue is better but not great. The Strategic Plan is being implemented. The District is in need of a new Suburban and at least one new school bus. These capital investments will require \$140,000 to \$160,000 to replace. The just completed audit provided a windfall of approximately \$175,000 increase in the General Fund. Mr. Selle asked the Board to consider using the General Fund increase to purchase the vehicles. This idea would result in a one time deficit spending year for the District. However, the District would avoid paying interest on loans to finance the purchases and it would avoid the need to include the payments in future budgets. This is only a proposal at this time.

Mr. Ron Rodriguez stood in front of the Board stating, "When are we going to approach Common Core? You keep calling it state standards but really it's Common Core. You got your raises and I hope you are happy but when do we start to support the kids?" There was no response from the Board.

A concerned mother reported to the Board her child has severe allergies and needs the availability of the school nurse beyond 2:00 p.m. in the afternoon. If that were not possible then her daughter needs to have an epinephrine pen available in the classroom. The Board indicated they would look into the issue.

After approval of the minutes from the August 4, 2014, meeting Chairman Gaide moved on to a thank you from Roberta Eggleston, Geometry teacher who thanked the Excellence in Education Committee and the donors who supplied the new text book.

Trustee Dr. Davis offered some encouraging words regarding BOCES. She indicated people are happy with the Special Education after the reorganization and "we are finally getting the services we (students) deserve. Dr. Davis was very upbeat and positive about the changes made at BOCES to improve the delivery of their services.

The following personnel were hired and unanimously approved by the Board: Lisa Kaufman - Elementary Paraprofessional, Leda Baca - Upper Elementary Paraprofessional / Drama Teacher, Robert O'Callaghan - Cross Country Assistant Coach, (pending background check), Sandra Dodson - School Nurse, and Eleanor Straight - Extra Curricular Activities Drama Instructor.

Holly Anderson, Elementary School Principal, gave a detailed report on the results of the TCAP Data. Reading: Students did better in the use of literary information, fiction poetry and vocabulary. Needed improvement areas are non-fiction and literature. Mathematics: Students did better in patterns and proportional thinking, measurement, and the use of data and geometry. Algebra, number sense, and statistics need improvement. Writing: Students performed poorly overall in this area. Ms. Anderson indicated this was disappointing considering the amount of time and effort that was paid to instruction in this area. Ms. Anderson felt emphasis on grammar and usage, conventions and extended writing are good starting points for improvement.

High Mountain Hay Fever Festival Association Makes Donations to Area Nonprofits

The High Mountain Hay Fever Festival Association Board is pleased to announce donations to two area nonprofit organizations in 2014, the West Custer County Hospital District and CART (Cliffs Action Revitalization Team).

High Mountain Hay Fever (HMHF) plans to donate \$42,000 to the West Custer County Hospital District over the course of the next five months to support the maintenance and operation of the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) provided to our community by the Hospital District. The first of three \$14,000 donations will be made to the Hospital District on October 1, 2014. Two additional \$14,000 donations to the Hospital District are planned over the coming months at the discretion of the HMHF Board.

High Mountain Hay Fever will also

donate \$8,000 to CART to support the Main Street Initiative and the work of the new Main Street Manager, Karen Loucks Rinedollar. The donation is part of a three-year pledge by the Festival Association to consider funding Main Street Initiative's efforts to increase tourism and promote economic development in the towns of Silver Cliff and Westcliffe.

In a separate action taken earlier, the HMHF Board decided to treat the event itself as a community service. Towards this end the Board decided to expand its entertainment budget in order to continue to provide the best in bluegrass and Americana performers.

High Mountain Hay Fever Bluegrass Festival was another great success in 2014 with about 4,000 attendees. The festival is a non-profit effort to en-

hance the Wet Mountain Valley as a quality event destination that benefits the entire community. High Mountain Hay Fever has raised over \$400,000 for the Wet Mountain Valley nonprofits over the twelve years of the festival.

The High Mountain Hay Fever Festival Association is a non-profit organization run by an incredible group of volunteers who work year round to make the festival happen. The festival remains an intimate event, avoiding the sprawl and congestion of large festivals while offering nationally recognized bluegrass performers and remaining true to its motto: "Small Scale, Big Time".

Principal, reported she has been spending a great deal of time working with teachers since the beginning of the year due to the number of new teachers she supervises. Mrs. Jones reported she has been working with the Alpine system which provides a place to see TCAP and CMAP scores

located in one area. Since Alpine is computer based it is possible to do statistical analysis which should help in the assessment of needs.

Mrs. Jones offered her observations of the instruction going on in the secondary classrooms over the last two and one half weeks. These observations are based on her extensive time spent observing. "I have not gone into one classroom on any day when in-

struction and student engagement was not happening. Teachers are teaching bell to bell."

The changes to the Student Handbook are being implemented but it is a work in progress. Cell phone use and the dress code are areas requiring more emphasis.

The Board adjourned into Executive Session to discuss the Superintendent evaluation process.

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"Virtual Schooling" at Its Finest: *Academics and Animal Husbandry*

Greg and Nancy Watkins' daughter, Grace, is one busy young woman. Enrolled in a world-class, online public school and raising a multitude of goats and sheep for show competitions, the vibrant 7th grader is not wasting any time in her packed day.

The school Grace is enrolled in is Colorado Connections Academy, a certified, online Colorado public school authorized by state law under contract with the Mapleton Public School District in Colorado. According to the school's website, "Colorado Connections Academy (ColoCA) is a tuition-free, public, K-12 online school from home in Colorado. ColoCA brings a fully accredited public education directly to your family's door - anywhere in Colorado."

Because it is a public school program, all of the materials needed are provided free of charge. Unlike homeschool families who have to find and purchase their own curriculum, families are given a computer, textbooks, workbooks, even science kits and PE materials.

As opposed to traditional homeschooling where the parent or caregiver is the teacher, at the Colorado Connections Academy online public school, the parent or caregiver is the child's "learning coach."

The school's online teachers are all state-certified and "have extensive training in curriculum and technology and work together from a centralized location." The students are even provided an online homeroom teacher and an advisor teacher! Grace says she gets free, new textbooks every year and has a lot of interaction with her online teachers. Standardized tests, such as Colorado's TCAP test are taken in a centralized location, and for Grace, it is in Pueblo.

If additional support is necessary for a student, Colorado Connections Academy provides a whole host of options including extra classroom time and teacher assistance, additional classes with one-on-one support

from the teachers, and online and by phone teacher mentoring. It is a comprehensive program.

Colorado Connections Academy is a very attractive public school alternative for parents who need a more flexible schedule or individualized learning plan. So, what does 7th grader Grace do in her spare time? When she was 6 years old, Grace joined the Cloverbuds 4-H program here in Custer County wanting to raise and show animals. Grace is now a member of the Triple C Clover 4-H Club in Westcliffe which has approximately 25 kids involved. She will also be going to the Aksalben 4-H Show in Omaha, Nebraska in September.

The U.S. Constitution is Signed September 17, 1787

After the end of the Revolutionary War in 1781, the 13 states were governed by the Articles of Confederation which gave the central government the power to govern foreign affairs, conduct war matters, and regulate money. It was a loosely written document and the Congress was limited in its power to enforce its requests of the states to provide the money or the troops. It was apparent that something "new" needed to happen to keep this young country united. They could either amend the Articles of Confederation or draft a new governing document. In May of 1787, delegates representing 12 of the 13 states (Rhodes Island was not represented) convened at Independence Hall in Philadelphia for a Constitutional Convention and began to draw up a new scheme of government. War hero, George Washington, was elected the convention president.

After much intense debate, hard work, and consideration of several different plans, the delegates devised a unique governing system of checks and balances. However, the delegation was still divided on the issue of representation in the Congress. States with the most population wanted proportional representation while less populated states wanted equal representation. A compromise, called the "Connecticut Compromise," was reached with proportional representation in the House of Representatives and equal representation in the Senate. On September 17, 1787, by the end of the Convention, and of the remaining delegates still present, 38 of the 41 delegates signed the new Constitution of the United States.

Now, this new document needed to be ratified by the states. Per article VII of the Constitution, nine of the thirteen states needed to ratify the document before it would become binding. An easy job? Not necessarily.

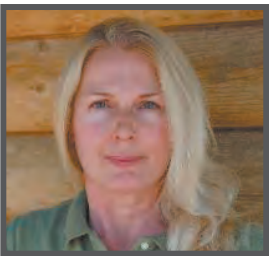

Downtown Cañon City is once again under construction. The 400 block of Main will, after months of headaches for merchants and the public alike, look like the 500 block of Main. Most of the people I have spoken with do not necessarily think this is a good thing. This fact, will not deter City Council or C-DOT. Once they have decided what is good for the residents of our town, they jump right in and go about affecting those changes even if the citizens make it crystal clear they do not agree.

The project to change the highway 50\Dozier\Steinmeier intersection (more commonly known as the Walmart intersection) is proceeding as if there were no objections to this massive project with an estimated price tag of 2.5 million dollars. The project is 88% funded by the state according to city Engineer Adam Lancaster. What he fails to remind us is that funds from the state come with a price tag, usually a piece of our liberty. Please remember the state is only giving us back our own money with strings attached. The real problem with this particular project, much like the fourth street project, is not only is it costly but most of the residents do not feel it is needed. Numerous residents have told me they travel through the intersection in question on a daily

One wonders, does traffic calming mean they would like to make it less inviting for drivers to visit the Historic Downtown Area? Our High School Marching bands will need to be able to march in a ribbon effect to manage the narrowed intersections.

These issues do not give our planners cause for pause, they just forge ahead even while admitting that with the 2.5 million intersection project they have no idea what the finished project will look like. Guess that is the new normal, sign on the dotted line and read the details when it is too late. Time to pull our heads out of the sand and start demanding responsible behavior on the part of the people we employ. Pieces of the Prophetic Puzzle Taking Shape

Turkey, a major player in end time prophecy (Magog, Meshech, Tubal, Pergamos), responded to the US “president’s” new Arab Spring strategy announced in his Wednesday address to Americans. A high level Turkish government official Thursday told AFP that “Turkey will not be involved in any armed operation but will entirely concentrate on humanitarian operations. Turkey will not take part in any combat mission, nor supply weapons.” AFP reports that Turkey is the only Muslim country in a coalition of 10 countries who agreed at the recent NATO summit to fight the Islamic State, but as we can see, it is not. Conversely, Turkey has been criticized for its indirect support of the Islamic State (IS).

Moreover, the occupant of the Oval Office continued as a Muslim apologist saying that the IS, which he calls ISIL (Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant) is not Islamic and that Muslims are its greatest victims. And ISIL is certainly not a state. It was formerly al Qaeda’s affiliate in Iraq, and has taken advantage of sectarian strife and Syria’s civil war to gain territory on both sides of the Iraq-Syrian border. It is recognized by no government, nor by the people it subjugates. ISIL is a terrorist organization, pure and simple. And it has no vision other than the slaughter of all who stand in its way.*”

Many wonder how the end time beast empire spoken

of by the prophets in the Bible could rapidly come to power. While we may not be witnessing the rise of the actual end time beast empire, we may be seeing a foreshadow of just how quickly these events can take shape. The “president” is obviously selling to a mostly unaware and ignorant public that the caliphate in the Levant (which includes Israel and Jerusalem) does not represent Islam. He boldly claims that no religion would kill innocent people. But Islam has been doing it for centuries. He ignores that the IS Caliphate not only is carrying out the Quran in word and in deed, but also believes it is ushering in the end times from an Islamic eschatological vision.

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Common Core Teaches Kids New Way To Add 9 + 6 That Takes 54 Seconds

(Editor/GG: This is what is coming. Absolute insanity from our educational system. Our kids don’t stand a chance with this nonsense. And this is what OUR school board here in Custer County endorses.)

It’s back-to-school time, America. As a courtesy to parents sure to be frustrated with their children’s infuriating Common Core homework, Buffalo, New York, NBC affiliate WGRZ has published a series of helpful videos.

The first of the six videos informs parents about the new way to add 9 + 6. Parents could be in for a surprise if they are merely familiar with the old, boring way, which is to reinforce that “9 + 6 is 15” again and again until it becomes second nature.

“With the Common Core, students need to understand why” 9 + 6 equals 15, a bubbly WGRZ reporter explains.

Fourth-grade teacher Eileen Klag Ryan then demonstrates the Common Core way to add 9 + 6.

This Common Core method takes nearly a minute.

“Our young learners might not be altogether comfortable thinking about what 9 + 6 is,” Ryan relates. “They

are quite comfortable thinking about their friend, 10.”

The novel addition method emphasizes 10 for younger students “as we’re working in ‘Base 10 System.’”

“So if we can partner 9 to a number and anchor 10, we can help our students see what 9 + 6 is.”

At no point does Ryan explain how this impressively complex method of adding 9 + 6 will lead students to any understanding of “why” 9 + 6 is 15.

“We’re going to decompose our 6,” the teacher continues, drawing two small diagonal lines under the 6, then adding a number 1 and a number 5.

“We know 6 is made up of parts,” she instructs. “One of its parts is a 1 and the other part is a 5.”

Then, things get super-complex.

“We’re now going to anchor our 9 to a 1, allowing our students to anchor to that 10” Ryan says, while drawing a big, oblong circle around the 9 and the 1.”

“Now our students are seeing that we have 10 + 5,” she declares confidently. She stutters a bit and adds, “Having, uh, now more comfort seeing that 10 + 5 is 15. That’s much more comfortable than looking at 9 + 6.”

Earlier this month, Canada’s *National Post* reported that a group of neuroscientists has issued a study finding that rote memorization of discrete math facts plays a critical role in mathematical development in young children.

In short, the study found, memorizing multiplication tables and answers to basic arithmetic problems is cognitively vital because, without such memorization, children will have a much harder time later on with complex math problems.

Common Core, a scheme to homogenize various K-12 standards around the country, has faced a growing wave of opposition since 45 states and the District of Columbia began implementing it last year. Opposition has brought together conservatives who are opposed to centralized, one-size-fits-all public education and leftists who deplore ever-more standardized testing.

Perhaps the best example of Common Core’s sharp focus on “why” in math came last summer when *The Daily Caller* exposed a video showing a curriculum coordinator in suburban Chicago perkily explaining that Common Core allows students to be totally right if they say 3 x 4 = 11 as long as they spout something about the necessarily faulty reasoning they used to get

to that wrong answer.

New York State is ground zero for the growing backlash against Common Core among parents.

In April, for example, parents, teachers and school officials complained because The Empire State’s standardized test in English Language Arts featured a slew of brand-name products including iPod, Barbie, Mug Root Beer, and Life Savers. For Nike, the tests even conveniently included the shoe company’s ubiquitous slogan: “Just Do It.” The brands — and apparently even some of their familiar trademark symbols — appeared in tests questions for students ranging from third to eighth grades.

In the fall, thanks to a combination of Common Core and new teacher evaluations, some four- and five-year-old students in New York City were forced to fill in bubbles on multiple-choice, standardized tests. Many of the kids couldn’t even hold a pencil, let alone bubble in. Others continually tried to help their friends get the right answers.

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Bob Beauprez:

I’ll Withdraw Colorado From PARCC

Gubernatorial candidate Bob Beauprez came out strongly for choices and local control over education in a conference call Wednesday evening. About 150 parents, educators, and citizens joined Beauprez and his lieutenant governor pick Jill Reppella on the call to hear him explain his stance on education and the roles of states and the federal government.

Paul Lundeen, Chairman of the Colorado State Board of Education, kicked off the call with a timeline and an intimate look at how Colorado became embroiled in education controversy. He began in 2008 with passage of SB 08-212, or CAP4Kids, which called for Colorado to develop a set of educational standards. Under guidance from that bill, Colorado educators worked together to develop standards in 10 content areas.

The State Board formally adopted the Colorado Academic Standards in De-

cember 2009. Eight months later, the State Board narrowly voted to adopt the Common Core State Standards in math and language arts. Colorado Department of Education staff then integrated the changes from Common Core in those two subject areas.

While the standards had already been adopted, the State Board had refrained from joining a national testing consortium as required to receive Race to the Top grant money. Then in 2012, Gov. Hickenlooper signed HB12-1240, a bill that required Colorado’s participation in a national testing consortium.

Given only two effective choices, the State Board authorized Colorado to join Partnership for Assessment of Readiness for College and Career (PARCC). The standardized testing mechanism enforces compliance with Common Core math and language arts standards.

Lundeen acknowledged that the standards themselves shouldn’t have to drive classroom instruction. “Standards are not curriculum,” he said, “but when standards are linked to an assessment, they begin to control curriculum.”

HB12-1240 included the stipulation that Colorado could leave the PARCC consortium as soon as January 2014. Right now, an increasingly vocal movement of parents and educators is asking legislators to do just that. Leaving the consortium, Lundeen explained, requires three signatures: that of the commissioner of education, the

High School Principal Outlaws Chick-fil-A Sandwiches Over Gay Rights

(Editor/GG: This is really hard to believe, but when you put left-wing educrats in charge, this is what you get. This debacle was in California, but remember last year's school Christmas show here in Custer County? All mention of God and Christ erased in the songs. Think local.)

A California high school principal has banned the football booster club from selling Chick-fil-A sandwiches during a back-to-school night fundraiser because she disagrees about gay marriage with the president of the Atlanta-based fast food chain.

The principal who outlawed Chick-fil-A sandwiches is

Val Wyatt of Ventura High School in the coastal town of Ventura, California.

"With their political stance on gay rights and because the students of Ventura High School and their parents would be at the event, I didn't want them on campus," Wyatt said, according to CBS Los Angeles.

Wyatt said she is worried that the presence of the chicken sandwiches might offend someone.

The superintendent of the Ventura Unified School District, Trudy Tuttle Arriaga, backed the decision.

"We value inclusivity and diversity on our campus and all of our events and activities are going to adhere to our mission," Arriaga said in explaining

the decision to exclude a chicken sandwich company because of the political beliefs of its president.

A student, Graham Wallace, also heartily endorsed the decision to ban Chick-fil-A over politics because gay students might be exposed to the sandwiches.

"There are gay kids that go to our school, and for them it might be kind of weird," Wallace said, according to the station.

The Chick-fil-A restaurant located in Ventura and its owner, Robert Shaffer, have donated \$21,000 to the Ventura school district since the franchise first opened its doors.

The restaurant had planned to donate about 200 meals for the Ventura High School

Football Booster Club to sell at the fundraiser. The booster club expected to raise about \$1,600, which it would use for uniforms, food, and other purchases.

A local parent, Michelle Cisneros, said she was infuriated by Wyatt's decision. Her fury prompted her to complain to school district officials.

"Everybody is embraced," Cisneros said, according to CBS Los Angeles. "And Chick-fil-A should have been allowed to be here."

Shaffer, the local franchise owner, said his restaurant has no position on gay marriage.

"Chick-fil-A doesn't have a stance on gay marriage," Shaffer said, according to Fox News. "We treat every-

one who walks through our doors, regardless of their religion or sexual orientation, with honor, dignity, and respect."

Nationally, hatred among some gay marriage advocates against Chick-fil-A runs deep because S. Truett Cathy, the now deceased founder of the fast-growing, fast-food goliath founder, famously opposed gay marriage.

Cathy's son, Dan Cathy, the current Chick-fil-A CEO, said in a 2012 radio interview that same-sex

marriage is "inviting God's judgment on our nation."

"I pray God's mercy on our generation that has such a prideful, arrogant attitude to think that we would have the audacity to try to redefine what marriage is all about," he added.

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ATF To Unveil Model of Davidian Compound Where Feds Roasted Children Alive

The institutional stupidity of the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms seems to be without limits.

The U.S. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives is unveiling a detailed wooden re-creation of the Branch Davidian compound on February 28, 1993, the start of a standoff in Waco that proved to be one of the agency's defining moments.

Four agents were shot to death and 79 people died in a massive blaze that capped a 51-day ordeal that captivated the nation, and to this day draws controversy.

Two identical balsa wood models, which are about 4 feet by 5 feet wide and took 18 months to build, were donated by architects, according to the ATF.

They are to be unveiled Wednesday and be displayed at the ATF's Houston Division headquarters, as well as at the coming National Law Enforcement Museum, in Washington, a project of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund.

A spokesman for the rogue agency that botched the assault stated:

"The model, intended as a tool to both educate the public and foster new generations of law enforcement, is fitted with LED lights marking 18 key positions on the compound property. Each light is activated by a button located around the model's edge, in effect allowing it to be a self-narrating educational tool."

Will the "tool" note that David Koresh was frequently seen in town unarmed in Waco, and could have been arrested at any time, without incident?

Will the model note that the driving desire for the flashy raid was to justify the ATF's continued existence at a time when their funding was in jeopardy?

Will the model have any lights noting that this incompetently executed and unnecessary raid left 86 people dead, including four ATF agents and more than 20 children?

Somehow I doubt it.

Also, I'd like to know why they chose the "before" version of the compound...

Maryland Sheriff to Feds: Try and Take Our Guns, and You'll Get a Civil War

Early last year, as Americans feared that the federal government would enact unconstitutional anti-gun measures via executive edict, support for the Constitution came from some unlikely places. Even in Oregon, a Democrat stronghold in elections, Linn County Sheriff Tim Mueller flat-out declared that he and his office would refuse to enforce any such unconstitutional federal laws or regulations.

Mueller wrote, "We are Americans. We must not allow, nor shall we tolerate, the actions of criminals, no matter how heinous the crimes, to prompt politicians to enact laws that will infringe upon the liberties of responsible citizens who have broken no laws."

Mueller later stated, "We're restricted and prohibited from enforcing all types of federal laws, including immigration laws. It would be unreasonable for anyone to think that I would enforce a federal firearms law."

Since then, anti-gun crusaders have slowed down amidst fierce push-back from patriots. Still, patriotic law enforcers are willing to speak out.

Wicomico County Sheriff Mike Lewis, a sheriff in the state of Maryland, recently reminded the citizens of his county that he will not violate the Constitution and warned the federal government that any attempt to disarm Americans will result in an all-out Civil War.

"I made a vow and a commitment," Lewis said. "As long as I am sheriff of this county, I will not allow the federal government to come in here and strip my citizens of the right to bear arms."

Sheriff Lewis is mindful of keeping firearms out of the hands of dangerous felons, but also explained, "We do not need to strip law abiding citizens of their Second Amendment right to bear arms. That I get upset over. I really do."

Sheriff Lewis also added a stern warning to the federal government about what will happen if they try to disarm the law-abiding populace:

"I can tell you this," Lewis is said, "if they attempt to do that, it will be an all-out civil war. No question about it."

It's encouraging to see that even as federal lawmakers and supposed federal law enforcers forget their duty to preserve liberty on behalf of the American people, rampant tyranny is bound to be checked by local authorities and the will of a fierce American population that is armed and unwilling to acquiesce to tyrants.

Major Restaurant Chain to Gun Owners: We Respect Your Rights, but Leave Your Firearms at Home

Panera Bread is asking customers not to bring firearms into its locations, becoming the latest company to take an anti-gun stance in an attempt to "preserve the environment we are working to create for our guests and associates."

The new policy asks that no one other than law enforcement officers bring guns into any Panera Bread location.

In a Monday statement, the restaurant chain cites "Panera Warmth" as part of the reasoning behind the decision:

"Within our company, we strive to create Panera Warmth. This warmth means bakery-cafes where customers and associates feel comfortable and welcome. To this end, we ask that guns not be brought into this environment unless carried by an authorized law enforcement officer. Panera respects the rights of gun owners, but asks our customers to help preserve the environment we are working to create for our guests and associates."

Anti-gun groups, like former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg's Everytown for Gun Safety, have tried to pressure various businesses into announcing anti-gun policies.

Some of the anti-gun campaigns came after a pro-gun group, Open Carry Texas, held open carry demonstrations at establishments like Target and Kroger.

Self-Defense Shooting Outside Indianapolis Kroger Guts Argument To Ban Guns

New York billionaire Michael Bloomberg is funding Watts and the Moms Demand Action attempt to bully Kroger into disarming the 100 million American gun owners that shop in their stores.

Pot Industry Flexes Political Muscle and Politicians Accept Money Banks Won't

(Editor/GG: All democrat politicians taking the pot money. And surprise, surprise, Senator Udall is grabbing the most.)

It's probably unusual for political contributors to thank a candidate for taking their money, but that's what Mike Elliott, executive director for the Marijuana Industry Group, did at a pot-industry fundraiser for U.S. Rep. Ed Perlmutter last month.

"We really appreciate the fact we can come here and show you how much we appreciate you showing up and talking about it and giving you donations," Elliott told Perlmutter, D-Colo., and a group of about 50 marijuana business owners. "We want to do what every other industry does and, as time goes by, the fear of the unknown is going away and more people are going to be following your footsteps."

As Elliott spoke, organizers were collecting envelopes filled with contribution checks. Perlmutter was ready to talk about his legislation to allow the industry to bank pot proceeds, which are legal under Colorado law but still raise money laundering concerns with banks because marijuana remains illegal at the federal level.

"I want to thank everyone for being willing to step up and help me," Perlmutter said, standing in front of the offices of Vicente Sederberg, Colorado's ma-

jor marijuana industry law firm. "I have been talking about the banking problem because you got the federal law going one direction and the state law, especially in Colorado and Washington, going the other direction."

Attorneys disagree about pot contributions

Federal money laundering laws prohibit banks from accepting marijuana proceeds because the drug is still illegal under federal law. But federal elected officials, like Perlmutter and several other members of the Colorado delegation, increasingly are accepting contributions from marijuana business owners.

Carolyn Short, a retired lawyer who chairs Keep AZ Drug Free and opposed marijuana legalization efforts, said federal law doesn't prohibit the contributions, but it probably should.

"I don't think money from illegal activities, whether child porn or marijuana, should be used to fund political campaigns, and I think most people agree with me," she said. "The whole idea behind the money laundering statute that prohibits banks from taking in the money is you don't want to encourage or abet criminal activity."

Other legal experts say there is no prohibition in either campaign or criminal laws that prevent politicians from accepting marijuana money — even if it's illegal to sell pot under federal law. Like much of the burgeoning marijuana

legalization push, there are gray areas and conflicting laws that politicians and regulators have yet to settle.

Federal Election Commission rules prohibit candidates from taking money from corporations, unions, national banks, government contractors, and foreign entities, but do not address proceeds from a business that might operate legally in states but violate federal laws. In an email exchange, a spokeswoman wrote the FEC has not received any requests for legal guidance about marijuana contributions.

But former Denver City Attorney David Fine, who helped set up Denver's medical marijuana regulations and now practices election law, said that is likely to change.

"It's a novel question and one that the FEC has not opined on," he said in a phone interview.

Richard Collins, who teaches constitutional law at the University of Colorado, said federal directives to banks and other entities after Colorado's legalization and the First Amendment right of political speech make it acceptable for politicians to take marijuana money in states where the drug is sold legally.

"I'm confident a candidate is in the clear," he said.

The Obama administration has told banks that they can accept marijuana money if the businesses comply with state law and make sure

the drugs don't get into the hands of children or leave the state, Collins said. Most banks have refused the deposits, determining they can't monitor the actions of their depositors that closely.

But Collins said he doesn't believe political candidates have to monitor their contributors.

"As long as the activity within the state is legal, the contribution is legal," he said.

Pot political power grows

The Colorado congressional delegation, which opposed Colorado's recreational legalization initiative in 2012, are nevertheless starting to represent their HTC-selling constituents' needs in Washington, D.C.

In past two years, FEC records show total pot-related contributions — either from industry PACs or individuals who operate marijuana-related businesses — to Colorado federal candidates were about \$20,000. It is nearly impossible to determine a comprehensive amount because only a handful of contributors note their marijuana connections on FEC forms.

But pot's political clout is increasing. Elliott said the July fundraiser for Perlmutter collected about \$20,000. FEC disclosures for that period are not due until Oct. 15. And in July, Perlmutter said there was another pot-industry fundraiser before the July 1 event.

Elliott said the marijuana industry, which in Colorado is valued at about \$600 million and growing, mostly focused on state races in the past, but have turned their attention to federal campaigns because of the banking issue.

"Federal banking laws make the marijuana business federally illegal, and that issue is so dire that someone will die over this issue," he said in phone interview last week. "People in California have already died, and it's just a matter time before it happens here. It's a huge public safety issue."

Colorado delegation pushes legislation to help pot industry

Perlmutter repeatedly has pushed legislation that would allow banks to accept marijuana funds where state law allows legal sales. He said it's a public safety issue because dispensary owners who have a lot of cash and marijuana are attractive targets for robbers.

"The cash component — you know better than I do — subjects you to various armed robberies," he told the crowd on a cool July evening in Denver. "There is always the white-collar aspect of skimming, tax evasion, but really the violent crime (aspect), we're trying to straighten this up."

Danielle Radovich Piper, Perlmutter's chief of staff, said at the fundraiser the campaign does not accept cash contributions, so once the money is in bank ac-

counts, it's legal for them to accept.

Perlmutter's campaign manager refused to discuss the issue last week.

"Neither Ed or the campaign discuss fundraising activities," Chris Kennedy wrote in an email. "The campaign fully complies with all FEC guidelines, laws and reporting deadlines."

U.S. Rep. Diana DeGette, D-Colo., also sponsored a bill that would help the industry. The bill would prohibit federal officials from enforcing the Controlled Substances Act in states that have legalized marijuana.

U.S. Sen. Mark Udall, D-Colo., has collected the most marijuana money so far, according to Watchdog.org's review of FEC records, but that may change in the next filing. Neither Udall nor DeGette's staff returned calls and emails seeking comment.

Perlmutter's and DeGette's bills haven't made it through Congress, but Perlmutter predicted the days of marijuana prohibition in the United States are numbered.

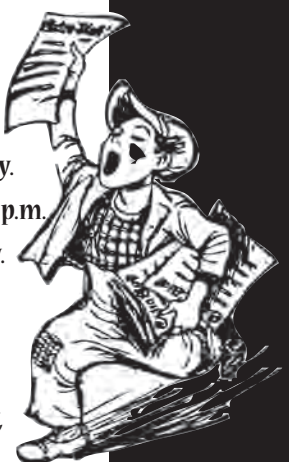
"Prohibition is over one state at a time, but prohibition is falling by the wayside, and our job is to get so it is working," he told supporters at the fundraiser.

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HICK GOES BELLY UP: Latest Poll Is All Bad For Hick

If Gov. John Hickenlooper's campaign was being run by the spazzes over at Sen. Mark Udall's campaign, the #copolitics twitter feed today would be spammed full of stories about mountain climbing, abortions, and NSA; basically, anything to distract how bad Hickenlooper's most recent poll numbers are. In the latest Rasmussen poll released today, former Rep. Bob Beauprez is up by one (45-44) over Hick. Things only get worse for Hickenlooper when we dig into the crosstabs.

Not only is Hickenlooper trailing Beauprez, but as the incumbent, the voters who turn out to vote on Election Day historically break hard against incumbents. If Hick is still trailing going into Election Day, he's as good as done. Even what many people view as Hick's greatest strength, his likability, is finally letting him down, as his favorable/unfavorable numbers are close to going negative (48/47). Such a small margin isn't large enough to overcome his biggest weakness, his

inability to lead, and most Coloradans have had enough of his ineffectual leadership as more people disapprove of the job Hick is doing than approve (47/45).

Hick's desire for everyone to love him on every single issue has finally caught up to him, as his handling of the fracking initiatives this year has ticked everyone off. Some Democrats aren't willing to vote for Hick after he sold them out; the number of Democrats voting for Hick has dropped from 84% to 76%.

To compound Hick's misery, other metrics in Rasmussen's poll point to it polling a more favorable electorate than Hick will see in November. In this poll, President Obama's favorable/unfavorable numbers are only an astounding -4 (47-51), while most every other poll conducted going back to the beginning of the year has Obama in the negative double-digits, with O's approval numbers hovering around only 40%.

Yet, this poll does not only reflect a gubernatorial race that Hick is just losing, but a race that Beauprez is just as much winning.

Beauprez's favorable/unfavorable numbers are an astounding +23 (47-24). Hickenlooper's so-called unwillingness to not go negative will shortly here be completely shattered. But, even that may be too late as Beauprez leads Hickenlooper among the most important issues to Coloradans this November. Coloradans trust Beauprez more on government spending and taxes as well which comes as no surprise as Hickenlooper has drastically grown the budget of the executive branch under his watch, as well as backing a billion dollar tax increase that Colorado voters overwhelming rejected last year. Coloradans also overwhelming side with Beauprez over Hick on the death penalty and Obamacare.

But, no worries Hick, this poll actually has a silver lining for you and Udall: after November, if you promise to carry the beer in your backpack, he'll take you mountain climbing with him.

chairman of the board of education, and the governor.

Despite public pressure, including a State Board resolution, Lundeen said that Gov. Hickenlooper will not sign a letter of withdrawal. As governor, Bob Beauprez promised participants in Wednesday's call that he would sign the letter to withdraw Colorado from the testing consortium.

The PARCC test that students across Colorado will begin taking this year is criticized for being intrusive, expensive, and reducing classroom learning time.

The test not only enforces the Common Core State Standards, but also helps to fulfill accountability requirements in the controversial SB10-191. Teacher performance is predicated partially on student success on this test. Beauprez said that under this requirement, "testing goes from being the tool to being the objective." While he agrees with accountability, he feels that a lighter touch is needed. Under recent reforms, teacher evaluations have gone from a four-page document to a 28-page document. Instead, Beauprez would like to bring marketplace principles into the teacher evaluation process.

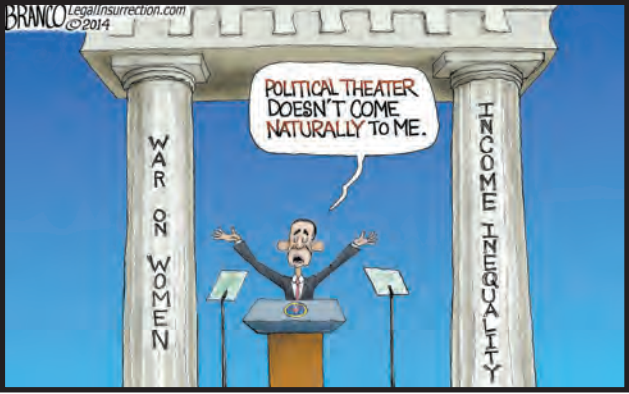
Beauprez said that he wants to "get back to trusting teachers and parents." As he travels

the state, teachers are telling him that they are no longer free to teach. They feel as though they are not allowed to control the discipline or the content of their classrooms. Their frustration is evident, so Beauprez suggests changes, perhaps a teachers' bill of rights, something to allow teachers to reach every little one in the classroom the way teachers do best. He suggests using the standards that Colorado educators developed, keeping the arts, drama, music, and dance classes that nurture the whole child.

Beauprez says that if he is elected governor, he will ensure that Colorado opts out of Common Core and PARCC, bringing Colorado families greater choice in education. He promises to sign the letter of withdrawal from PARCC. He also wants to re-examine existing Colorado standards in an effort to revert to the pre-Common Core version. He also would support initiatives like a scholarship tax credit to make sure that Colorado students have access to exceptional opportunities regardless of income.

When asked how he would respond to resulting federal pressure through threats of reduced funding, he had strong words. "I will stand with Bobby Jindal and sue the federal government," Beauprez said. "Government is holding children hostage with funding. I will fight back with every fiber of my being."
