

Bobcats Win Homecoming Game

The CCHS football team took on Cripple Creek-Victor for homecoming on Saturday and gave the crowd a homecoming victory 44-14. The game was never in doubt as the Bobcats took a 26-0 lead into halftime.

Sam Dunlap got the Bobcats on the scoreboard with a 4-yard touchdown in the 1st quarter. It would be the 1st of 5 touchdowns for Dunlap. “Sam has had a great year for us,” said Head Coach Troy Bomgardner. “He has shown great leadership and drive. He is the only senior on the team and he knows we are building for the future and he is willing to do what it takes to help the program.”

The second score for the Bobcats was a pass from Edgar Pedigo to Billy Berry. The 17 yard TD put the Bobcats up by 2 scores early in the 2nd quarter. Andy Feldmann added another score with a 12-yard run and some great blocking by the offensive line of Bryce Roscoe, Keith Stuart, JJ

Brady, David Kinsey, and Billy Berry. “Andy is such a team player,” noted Bomgardner. “He just does what he is asked and does it 100%!”

Dunlap added another score and then the defense got into the action when Dylan Schoch picked off a Cripple Creek pass near the 50 and returned it inside the 5-yard line. The Bobcats

came up short but headed into the locker room with a 26-0 lead.

The second half was more of the same with the Dunlap adding a few more touchdowns and all the Bobcats getting into the game. Kobe Lewsader added another interception for the Bobcats to set up a touchdown. “Kobe had a great week of practice and it was

good to see it pay off in the game,” said Bomgardner. “He gives great effort all the time and is really improving as a player.”

Dunlap ended up with 155 yards rushing and 5 TD’s while Feldmann added 100 yards and 1 TD. Berry led receivers with 3 catches for 58 yards. Pedigo was 5 of 11 passing for 66 yards. Chad Lewenkamp added a

Defensively, Feldmann had maybe his best game of the year with 17 tackles, with Kinsey and Roscoe adding 8 each.

Secure The Door Fundraiser for CCCS

In light of recent events concerning school security around the country, Custer County School District C-1 Superintendent Mark Payler has initiated a fundraising drive to raise money to replace the unsafe front entrance doors to our school with a modern door system that will provide a much more safe environment for our kids and school staff.

Superintendent Payler described the type of door system in an email to the *Sentinel* last Friday:

“My vision for securing the main entry is to have a time-controlled lock on a set of doors that would be open during the first and last part of the day when students are entering the building. At a set time, the door then locks. Mounted on the building would be a secure box with a push button/notification system with a video camera, microphone, and speaker. A person requesting entry into the building would push a button that would

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The Word on the Street

Within the past few weeks there has been much discussion regarding the closing or possible pending closing of some of our local restaurants. As always happens when several events seem to coincide, people rightfully begin looking for reasons for those events. As coincidence would have it, the announcement of the closing of one restaurant and hints of other possible closings has come shortly on the heels of a letter to restaurants regarding safety inspections.

In order to clarify possible misinformation and dispel the link between that letter and restaurant closings, the public needs to be apprised of the sequence of events that led to the letter being written, as well as the need and purpose for inspections.

In 2007, the town of Westcliffe adopted the International Building Code 2006 Edition (IBC 2006) in conjunction with IBC-Residential, the International Fire Code; and Existing Buildings Code. These codes outline requirements for the safe operation of commercial-cooking establishments, which are to be regularly inspected at designated intervals dependent upon the level of operation.

In order to put a process in place to abide by these codes, there were meetings and discussions over the course of several months between the Wet Mountain Fire Protection District (WMFPD) and Westcliffe town staff to develop a clearly-stated process

and train an inspector. Money was then appropriated jointly between the town and WMFPD to pay for training an inspector.

In the meantime a local restaurant owner called an outside inspector for an inspection which resulted in a notification to the WMFPD of equipment not meeting present codes. This notice was subsequently shared with the town of Westcliffe. Unfortunately, many of the buildings that house our business owners are not owned by the business owners which results in complications regarding who is responsible for necessary equipment upgrades. Once such a notice has been submitted, the town and the WMFPD have a legal responsibility to act upon that notice. Failure to do so would result in liability to both the town and the WMFPD for having failed to act upon a known fire-safety hazard should there be an incident.

Shortly after that report was submitted to the WMFPD, a local designee completed training to perform inspections and a letter was jointly composed by the Town of Westcliffe Building Inspector, the Fire Inspector, and the WMFPD Fire Chief informing local restaurants that inspections would begin taking place within the ensuing weeks at the convenience of the restaurant owners. For a variety of reasons, these inspections have yet to be scheduled and completed as of this date.

What is the purpose of regular inspections and why are they necessary?

According to the National Fire Protection Agency (NFPA)

Vent Hood Regulations, there are various requirements for inspections dependent upon the volume and the type of cooking operation. The majority of our local facilities fall under the classification of moderate to low cooking operations requiring inspections at six month intervals. The building and restaurant owners are charged a minimal fee of \$25 for these inspections and, assuming that they have properly maintained equipment and the cleaning of the equipment, there should be no further action necessary. The most typical violation is a build-up of grease which would require professional cleaning that could cost in the range of \$300 to \$400 if the situation is not extreme. With regularly scheduled inspections, build-up should not become extreme.

The purpose of inspections is for public safety and protection. Inspection reports and requirements do not to tell owners what they can or cannot do with their business but rather ensure that fire safety measures are in place. Statistics are the driving force for written codes in public buildings. According to the U.S. Department of Homeland Security Fire Administration National Fire Data Center (www.usfa.fema.gov/data/statistics), the number one cause of fire in non-residential buildings is cooking (i.e.: restaurants and grease fires).

As a community, we are especially vulnerable to fire. Our buildings are primarily wood structures with little or no fire separation, and many with

sleeping quarters above. A small grease fire could rapidly become a major downtown disaster with the potential for loss of life. If taking required fire safety measures seriously can help reduce the potential for such an incident, it is in our best interests to work together for public safety.

It is our intent to work with the local restaurants and businesses to maintain public safety as outlined in the Codes adopted by the Town. We have not had any restaurant owners contact us regarding undue burden or the need to close because we are implementing inspections. Rapid turnover in restaurant ownership is nothing new to our area and there are likely a number of factors contributing to possible closures. Owners who have restaurant experience are familiar with regular inspections when they begin operations; thus it is unlikely that receipt of a letter indicating the initiation of regular inspections would result in a decision to cease operations.

Fire Estimate Summaries present basic data on the size and status of the fire problem in the United States as depicted through data reported to the U.S. Fire Administration's (USFA's) National Fire Incident Reporting System. Each Fire Estimate Summary addresses the size of the specific fire or fire-related issue and highlights important trends in the data. Note: Fire Estimate Summaries are based on the USFA's "National Estimates Methodology for Building Fires and Losses" (http://www.usfa.fema.gov/downloads/pdf/statistics/national_estimate_methodology.pdf). The USFA is committed to providing the best and most currently available information on the U.S. fire problem and, as a result, continually examines its data and methodology. Because of this commitment, changes to data collection strategies and estimate methodologies occur, causing estimates to change slightly over time. Previous estimates on specific issues (or similar issues) may have been a result of different methodologies or data definitions used and may not be directly comparable to current estimates.

National estimates for the leading reported causes of fires in nonresidential buildings for 2013, the most recent year data are available, are:

1. Cooking: 27,400 fires.
2. Intentional: 9,100 fires.
3. Other unintentional, careless: 8,600 fires.
4. Heating: 8,400 fires.

Overall trends in the leading fire causes for the 10-year period of 2004 to 2013 show:

- Cooking as the leading reported cause of nonresidential building fires for the 10-year period.
- A 3 percent increase in nonresidential cooking fires.
- A 24 percent decrease in nonresidential intentionally set fires.
- A 20 percent increase in nonresidential other unintentionally or carelessly set fires.
- A 17 percent decrease in nonresidential heating fires.

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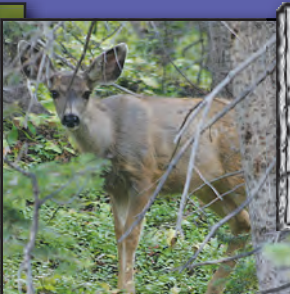

Eagle Med Experiences Turbulence in Custer County

At the September 30th meeting of the Board of County Commissioners, there was continued discussion of a proposal by Eagle Med to provide emergency helicopter ambulance for Custer County. Eagle Med originally approached the commissioners some weeks ago to propose providing air ambulance service to most county residents for a set fee. At that time Commissioners assigned the task of investigating the proposal to Christe Coleman and her Custer Emergency Services Committee. On this date Ms. Coleman returned with the recommendations of that committee.

Custer Emergency Services is a loosely-knit group of representatives of a diverse group of agencies in the county who have some connection to providing emergency services. At this particular meeting about half of the representatives to the committee were not present and a vote taken by the committee went in favor of considering a contract with Eagle Med by a margin of four to two. Ms. Coleman pointed out that "there's no structure for how this group handles things like this," and,

until recently, it was not asked to make recommendations on policy issues. The recommendation was made without consideration for how this service might be paid for or by whom it might be paid.

Several members of the Custer County EMS were present to reaffirm their position against approving a contract for this service with Eagle Med. They pointed out that their only concern was for the well-being of the patient, and, if the situation required flight evacuation, their only concern was for who could respond the fastest. They also pointed out that it would be unlikely that a patient in need of air transport would be able to state their preference for service.

No representative from Eagle Med was in attendance at the meeting.

A representative from Flight for Life, which has long been the provider of air ambulance service in the county was present and came armed with some enlightening information. At least 38% of people in the county would not be covered by any contract with Eagle Med either because of geography (parts of the coun-

ty would not be covered), or because they are covered by Medicare or Medicaid, which does not allow for reimbursement to Eagle Med. D.J. Head from Flight for Life pointed out that historically speaking, "Seventy-six percent of those who have been flown out (of Custer County) would not have been covered" by the Eagle Med program due to their status with Medicare or Medicaid. Mr. Head also pointed out that contrary to the popular misconception, the average cost to the patient for air ambulance service has been \$264 after insurance and write-offs.

Adding this additional service to the county would not only cost some unknown entity the sum to pay for the contract, but would also create additional dispatching confusion in determining who may or may not be covered by the program.

With or without a county-wide contract with Eagle Med, individuals can still choose to contract with them individually for service, and a membership drive for this service should be expected to be forthcoming if no county-wide contract is signed.

Westcliffe Town Board Members Walk Out of Meeting!

Johnston Refuses to Resign!

The regular scheduled Westcliffe Board of Trustees meeting opened quietly with the Pledge of Allegiance followed by the Roll Call. Trustees Cline and Nordyke were absent.

The issue of murals on The Courtyard Inn, placed without approval of the Trustees was primary item on the agenda. Trustee Johnston recused himself (he owns the property in question) physically vacating his chair, standing in the audience. Mayor Patterson offered a summary of the previous information in which Mr. Johnston indicated he supplied computer file drawings to Town Clerk Reis, which she was then unable to open due to a computer problem. Mayor Patterson went on to reiterate the issue focuses on the lack of following procedures by Mr. Johnston rather than the quality of the murals. The murals do not violate the Town Statutes even receiving positive comments regarding their improvement to the building.

Mayor Patterson asked for comments about approving the murals and then a motion to approve them in arrears or retrospect. Trustee Wenke spoke for the Board. "John, it's never been about the murals, ever! Its been about your attitude and your treatment of us as your colleagues and peers on this Board. You, by your actions thumbed your nose at us, thumbed your nose at the ordinances of this community, you thumbed your nose at this town. You took an oath and gave your word to uphold the ordinances of this town and you didn't do it. You did it not only once but twice. You did it in August and you did it again in September. During this whole time, your attitude and arrogance toward us was incredible. You showed no compunction at all about the way you act or behave. You have angered all of us on this Board and you have single-handedly destroyed the comradeship we have as a working body trying to do what is best for this town. We have a collegial relationship here even though we don't always agree. But, we respect each other but that is one thing you did not do. I don't know how any of us can trust you anymore. And frankly, John, I don't know how you can think any of

us want to work with you anymore. That's all I have to say."

Mayor Patterson asked Attorney Printz, "what happens if there is no decision on the resolution to approve the murals?" Mr. Printz replied, "The murals are not approved and they are contrary to the law. However, a duly called meeting was called, even though the meeting did not take place, it is apparent, if the meeting took place the Board would have approved the murals. They do not violate the statute and its provisions."

More discussion ensued with Mr. Thornburg inserting the idea the special meeting never would have been called if any other citizen behaved as Mr. Johnston did and in fact the Board would have sent him packing. A discussion took place between Mr. Printz and Mr. Wenke regarding the fine process, was it three hundred dollars or three hundred dollars a day? Mr. Thornburg then offered that Mr. Johnston should have a chance to speak while the delicate unknitting of the law was determined.

Mr. Johnston replied, "First, I will start off by extending a apology to the Board. I was arrogant and it was uncalled for. But the artist already showed up I was told that either he goes home or we ask for approval in hindsight. It put me in a difficult position about what to do with a gentleman I paid thousands of dollars. I didn't understand when you said you were not able to open the file, and then you responded back with "ok." I thought you did get it open. I was arrogant and I apologize to the Board for it. Let's look at the resolution itself, which prohibits getting things accomplished, by saying come back in three weeks after the Board approves your plan."

Mr. Thornburg refused to accept Mr. Johnston's apology. He accused Mr. Johnston of speaking "bull c**p" saying he was at both meetings. "I gave you the privilege of speaking John, and its bull c**p, John." Johnston asked, "Are you refusing to allow me to speak anymore?" "Just about, because you are not telling the truth. We asked you, we begged you, to tell us something about them." "I said, they would

be scenes of The Court Yard." Trustee Gluschke interjected, "You said you trust him (artist) and that's all you said. Even Brian, (Mr. Cline) said give us a piece of paper with a box and a flower in there and you are just rocking back and forth so arrogant, and it wasn't just once; two meetings, John, this has gone on for ninety days. You knew this for two years, he was coming - snail mail, forget it, send us an email. No one agrees they are distasteful, but you knew the process and as a Board member you snubbed the Town, our ordinances, and us, and I do not feel comfortable working with someone who has broken the cohesiveness of this Board."

Mayor Patterson then called the question on The Courtyard Inn murals. The vote was zero "for" and zero "against" with three "abstentions." Mayor Patterson said, "you have to vote something, and it was decided by the Town Attorney, "no" they did not. The motion failed since it had no support.

Mr. Printz then discussed the options. Mr. Johnston could be fined up to \$9,300 for the 31 days he violated the ordinance, (verified as \$300 per day while in violation); he could receive a public reprimand as already done, he could be asked to resign from the Board, or the Board could vote to terminate him as a Trustee.

In the end, the Board recommended a fine of three hundred dollars. (Approved). A second request was made by the Trustees asking Mr. Johnston to resign from the Board. Mr. Johnston indicated he polled his constituency and their consensus was he should NOT resign. He refused resignation and Trustees Gluschke abruptly indicated she could not continue to serve and then Mr. Wenke indicated the same with both vacating their chairs. (Now, in fairness, it is not clear if both Trustees resigned effective immediately or if they just walked away in a huff. Time will tell.) However, the Board no longer had a QUORUM!

No decisions, no official votes could be authorized from this point forward including setting a special meeting to cover the unresolved issues on the agenda for this meeting.

vidual, they could push a button to remotely open the entry door, while at the same time keeping a digital video of the front entry if that documentation is needed later.”

He also stated that he anticipates the cost to be about \$20,000 and that he is already seeking bids for the project.

The Hoover Dam

In the early 1900’s the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation began investigating the Black Canyon and the nearby Boulder Canyon for their potential to support a dam that would control floods, supply irrigation, and produce hydroelectric power. In 1928 Congress authorized the project.

At a dedication ceremony in 1930, then Secretary of the Interior Ray Layman Wilbur traveled to the Nevada desert to drive the spike marking the projects official start. He announced, “I have the honor and privilege of giving a name to this new structure. In Black Canyon, under the Boulder Canyon Project, it shall be called the Hoover Dam.” On May 8, 1933, then Interior Secretary Harold Ickes changed the name back to the Boulder Dam.

Construction of a 60–story, arch dam was no small feat. The first difficult step was the blasting of the canyon walls to create diversion tunnels for the water.

Next, they had to clear the walls that would contain the dam. In the meantime the dried riverbed allowed them to start construction on the power plant and the dam itself. The power plant was given a futuristic touch while its interior was designed to pay homage to the Native American cultures.

When the final block of concrete was poured and topped off at 726 feet above the canyon floor, the waters were allowed to fill the area that would become Lake Mead. On September 30, 1935, a crowd of 20,000 people gathered to watch President Franklin Roosevelt commemorate the structure’s completion.

Approximately 5 million barrels of cement and 45 million pounds of reinforcement steel had gone into what was then the tallest dam in the world.

The Hoover Dam is situated in the Black Canyon of the Colorado River on the border between the states of Arizona and Nevada.

On this day, October 9, 1936, the generators at the Boulder Dam (later renamed Hoover) began to generate electricity from the Colorado River and transmit it 266 miles to Los Angeles, California.

The Election is Coming! The Election is Coming! Get Informed, Get Your Ballot, Vote!

It's that time again when the most important duty of every American is upon us. The right to vote is a privilege that carries with it an awesome responsibility. It is the duty of every voter to be informed on the issues, candidates and propositions being presented. Samuel Adams said; "Let each citizen remember at the moment he is offering his vote that he is not making a present or a compliment to please an individual – or least he ought not so to do; but that he is executing one of the most solemn trusts in human society for which he is accountable to God and his country."

Here we go! Voter registration will be accepted all the way to election day. All elections will be mail-in ballots, sent out beginning during the week of October 12, 2015. They must be physically returned by November 3, 2015, at 7:00 p.m. Any ballots postmarked on November 3, 2015, will not count having been received after the deadline. So be safe and get those ballots in by November 2, 2015.

The state of Colorado has proposed a Proposition BB. It asks: "May the state retain and spend state revenues that otherwise would

be refunded for exceeding an estimate included in the ballot information for Proposition AA and use these revenues for public school building construction, law enforcement, and marijuana education instead of refunding these refunds to marijuana cultivation facilities, retail marijuana purchasers, and other taxpayers." This proposition resulted from the provisions of the Tax Payers Bill of Rights, (TABOR) activating when the tax revenue collected exceeded the amount projected. The average refund for individuals will be eight dollars and for a joint return sixteen dollars.

There are three members of the school board in Districts One, Two, and Three on the ballot for election. District One, current Board Member Brian Cline is running unopposed. District Two, Jake Shy, a local businessman and father of three girls, is running against Cynthia (Cyn) Williams. District Three, current Board Member Monty Lee, is also running unopposed.

There is one Custer County Ballot Question 1A. This issue will be answered only by those who are unincorporated. "Without increasing taxes, shall the citizens of Custer County,

Colorado, re-establish the county's right to provide any or all services currently restricted by Title 29, Article 27, Part 1 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, specifically described therein as "advanced services," "telecommunication services," and "cable television services," including, but not limited to, any new and improved high bandwidth services based on future technologies, using community-owned infrastructure including, but not limited to, any existing fiber optic network, either directly or indirectly with public or private sector service providers, to potential subscribers that may included telecommunications service providers and residential or commercial users with in the unincorporated areas of Custer County, but not including the incorporated Towns of Silver Cliff and Westcliffe, which must seek separate voter approval on this question if they so choose."

Voters can visit the Voter Service and Polling Center (VSPC) at the Custer County Courthouse to register, update your voter registration, or turn in a ballot. There will be one voting machine available toward the end of October for those voters wishing to cast their votes using the tried and true method.

The Center has previously issued reports using HSUS’ tax returns to show how little of your donations go to pet shelters. While HSUS will undoubtedly respond with some technical loophole to try to squirm its way out of this mess, the facts are the facts: HSUS raises money using starving and injured puppies and kittens to fund liberal political activities that have virtually nothing to do with pets. While such deceit may pass muster in Washington, D.C., Colorado’s elected officials remain grounded enough to call a spade a spade.

(CNSNews.com) - The U.S. House of Representatives voted 248 to 177 on Friday afternoon to approve a bill that would give a born baby who survives an abortion the same protection under the law as "any person who comes to a hospital, clinic, or other facility for screening and treatment or otherwise becomes a patient within its care."

Under the bill, the Congressional Research Service explained in its official summary of the legislation, "An individual who commits an overt act that kills a child born alive is subject to criminal prosecution for murder."

The bill would also "require any health care practitioner who is present when a child is born alive following an abortion or attempted abortion to: (1) exercise the same degree of care as reasonably provided to any other child born alive at the same gestational age, and (2) ensure that such child is immediately admitted to a hospital."

Five Democrats voted for the bill, and all 177 votes

against it were cast by Democratic members. One member, Rep. John Garamendi (D.-Calif.), voted present, and eight members, including three Republicans and five Democrats did not vote.

Among the members who voted against this bill that would clarify that it is an act of murder to kill a baby who survives an abortion were House Minority Leader Nancy Pelosi (D.-Calif.), Rep. Debbie Wasserman Schultz (D.-Fla.), Rep. Jackie Speier (D.-Calif.), and Rep. Carolyn Maloney (D.-N.Y.)

The bill was sponsored by Rep. Trent Franks (R.-Ariz.), who was joined by 98 co-sponsors. These included Rep. Marsha Blackburn (R.-Tenn.), Rep. Vicky Hartzler (R.-Mo.), and Rep. Kristi Noem (R.-S.D.).

"The Born Alive Abortion Survivor Protection Act protects little children who have been born alive," Rep. Franks said in a speech on the House floor before the vote. "No one in this body can obscure the humanity and the personhood of

these little born alive babies."

"The abortion industry labored all these decades to convince the world that unborn children and born children should be completely separated in our minds, that while born children are persons worthy of protection, unborn children are not persons and are not worthy of protection," he said.

"But those who oppose this bill to protect born alive babies now have the impossible task of trying to

join born children and unborn children back together again and then trying to convince all of us to condemn them both as inhuman and not worthy of protection after all," he said.

Rep. Carolyn Maloney spoke against the bill on the House floor.

"I stand in strong opposition to this punitive and intrusive bill," she said.

"This is politics at its most manipulative and politics that should never be permitted to come between a patient and her doctor," she said.

"This bill attempts to criminalize legal medical care and punish millions of women by rolling back reproductive choices. It wages a kind of guerilla warfare against Roe v. Wade by threatening doctors with jail time for providing care to their patients."

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Colorado Sheriffs Take Aim at Unconstitutional Gun Control Laws

In what might be the freedom's best shot — given the current Democrat control of the Colorado House of Representatives and Governor's Mansion — a group of county sheriffs, on Monday, argued their appeal against the unconstitutional gun control legislation signed into law by Governor John Hickenlooper in 2013. on private sales between citizens, a prohibition against loaning someone a firearm, and 20-round magazine restrictions are just a few conditions of these unnecessary and nonsensical laws that essentially cannot be enforced in any practical manner.

As far as a timeline for a decision, DiSpirito also reported that federal appeals cases usually require four to five months for a ruling to be handed down, but they can move more quickly in certain circumstances.

Until we can replace the governor in three years and regain a Republican majority in the State House of Representatives, it will be a steep uphill battle to fix these problems through the legislature. Like the federal courts have done in so many civil rights cases in the past, hopefully the court will rule in favor of law-abiding Coloradans on this constitutional issue.

Indeed, fresh off the pages of this morning's *Chicago Tribune* come these striking statistics:

For the second straight weekend, more than 50 people were shot across Chicago, including a 10-year-old girl grazed in the neck in Woodlawn on Sunday afternoon.

The toll included four men killed and at least 53 people wounded between Friday evening and early Monday morning, according to police. Last weekend, nine people were killed and at least 45 were wounded.

Consider that the death toll from just the last two weekends alone in Chicago is TEN TIMES that from yesterday's tragic school shooting. To be sure, each and every life lost is

a singular tragedy — whether in Chicago or in Roseburg. So why does our president seize on one but not the other?

Over the last four years, there have been no other back-to-back weekends with more than 50 shot, according to data collected by the Tribune. This past August, there were four straight weekends with more than 40 shot.

Chicago has seen at least 2,300 shootings so far this year, about 400 more than the same period last year and more than 500 over 2013, according to data compiled and analyzed by the Tribune. Through Monday morning, there were at least 370 homicide victims in Chicago, about 50 more than last year and about 30 more than 2013, the Tribune found.

The shooting trend in Chicago only continues to rise, and yet President Obama continues to ignore it. Certainly, what is

IS RUSSIA RELEVANT?

At this writing Russian war planes are striking targets in Syria that were at first thought to be ISIS strongholds. The Pentagon has now admitted that in fact the strikes were aimed at American supported rebels who are fighting Syrian strongman Bashar al-Assad and ISIS forces. It has long been understood that Russia has great interest in keeping Assad propped up to advance Putin's agenda of Middle East encroachment which is meant to replace the United States as the Middle East power broker.

Several years ago when Russia began her expansionist attitude a newspaper editorial read: "Russia's incursion into Georgia this week is proof once more that the Russian bear is a dangerous beast." 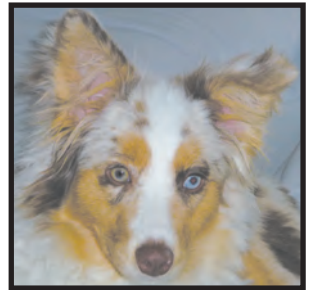

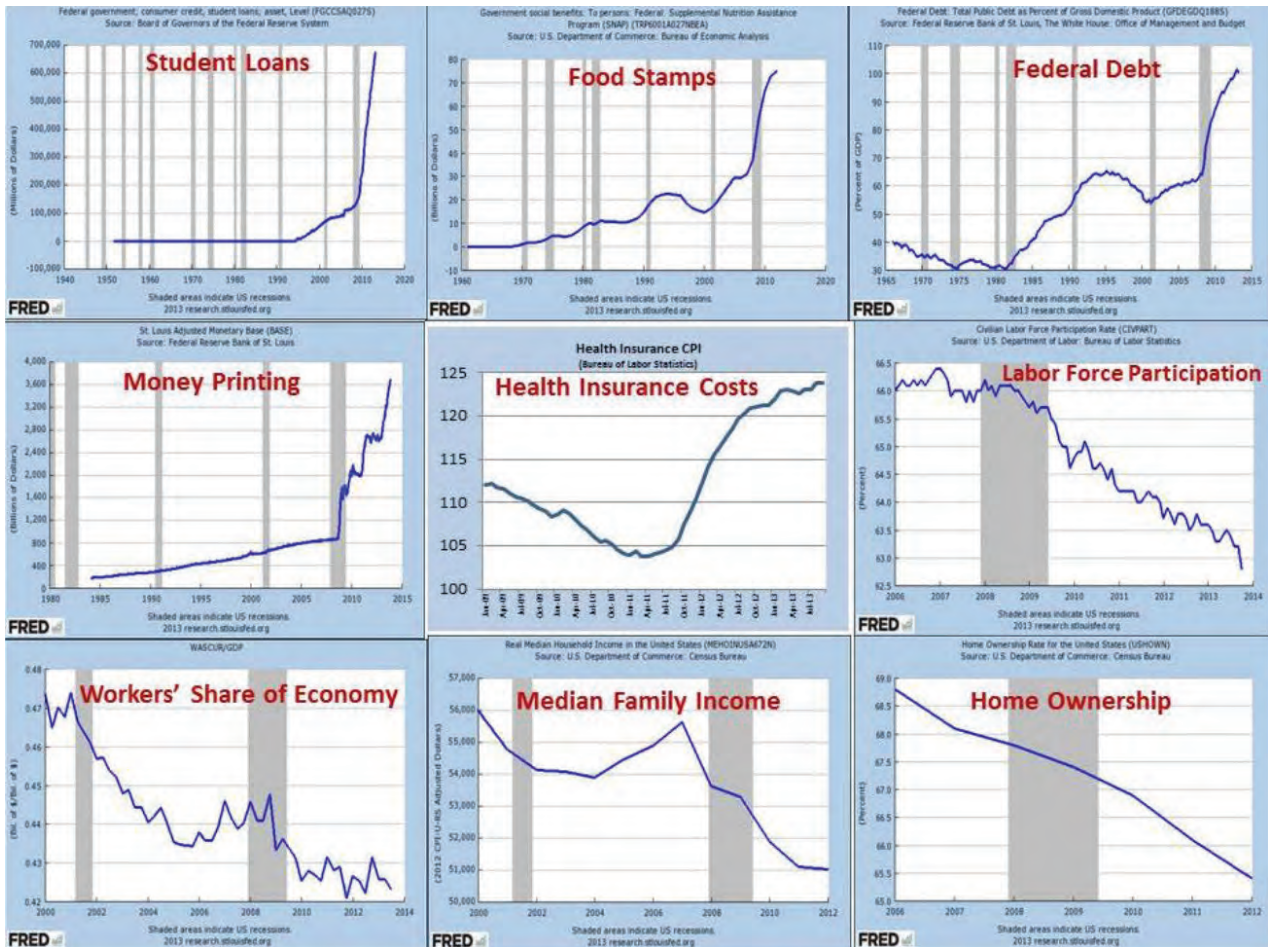

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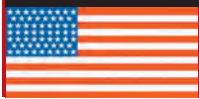
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
